
ICON KEY

Cruiser - Items treated with Cruiser seed treatment are marked with this symbol and highlighted in purple in the price tables.



Documents Required

- This color coded icon marks varieties that need signed documents / waivers in order for the product to be shipped. A page number and color will direct you to the document in the back of the book.



Game Changers - An item marked as a Game Changer is one that is gaining some traction with growers either through early release trialing or as a result of giving a new product a try. These products have the potential to become tomorrow's All Stars and bring something special to the table. These are "must try" products in this crop type.



Grower Preferred All-Stars

- Items marked with this symbol are "All Stars". They have been and will continue to perform consistently well for many growers across a wide geography. Growers really can't go wrong by planting these selections.

High Tunnel - Items marked with this symbol are recommended for high tunnel and protective culture production.



New - Most often this is a new release, but it can also be new to our lineup and not new in the market. Progressive growers that are producing similar varieties in this product category should consider giving this product a try to see if it works for them.

Rupp Logo - Our logo marks those varieties that have come from our research and development group as well as products for which we have exclusive marketing rights.

Sort Order - This symbol marks the column used to sort the information presented in each product description table. Usually alphabetical by item name or sorted by days maturity.

Vendor / Brand logos contained within are properties of their respective trademark holders.

GLOSSARY

AAS - All America Selection winner.

Anthocyaninless - Recessive gene that blocks the expression of purple pigment.

Bitterfree - (cucumbers) The plant and fruit lack cucurbitacins, a chemical, which gives a bitter taste.

Bolting - When plant begins to produce flowers and set seed.

Concentrated Ripening/Set - (tomatoes) When 80-90% of the fruit ripen within a short period of time.

Confectionery - (sunflowers) Used for human consumption.

Days from transplant - This refers to maturity from when transplants are planted outside in the field. Time from seeding to transplant will need to be added to calculate overall maturity.

Determinate - Plant habit where vine will cease to grow once it reaches a particular size.

Dwarf Indeterminate - (tomatoes) Plant habit where vine central stem continues to grow in length, but lateral branches do not.

Expansion Rate - Under ideal conditions, the number of cups of popped corn for every cup of unpopped corn.

F1 - see Hybrid

F300 - FarMore* F300, an advanced fungicide seed treatment technology, delivers protection for a variety of small-seeded vegetable crops against a broad spectrum of seed and seedling diseases.

FI400 - FarMore® FI400 provides early-season protection to prevent or eliminate damage caused by cucumber beetles.

Green Shoulder (GS) - (tomatoes)
The dark green shoulder on unripe
fruit, often the last area of the fruit to
ripen.

Gynoecious - (cucumbers) Plant with only female flowers.

Heritage Varieties - Varieties marked heritage varieties are long standing products that have been used for generations. Mainly open pollinated (OP) varieties.

Heterosis - The improved or increased function of characteristics in a hybrid offspring. A hybrid exhibits heterosis when its traits demonstrate significant enhancement over those of its parent varieties.

Heterozygous - When the parents in a sweet corn hybrid are of different types, i.e. SU x SE, the hybrid is heterozygous. Heterozygous hybrids have better vigor in cooler soils.

Holding Ability - The period of time a fruit will maintain marketability once it has reached maturity.

Homozygous - When both parents in a sweet corn hybrid are of the same type, i.e. SE x SE, they are considered homozygous. Homozygous hybrids typically have higher sugar content.

Hybrid (F1) - Hybrid seed is produced from the cross between two genetically pure varieties, typically from the same species. Hybrids are common in agriculture, especially for

crops that benefit from heterosis, such as corn and rice. Hybrids are created as a means to combine the positive and valuable characteristics of the parent varieties into a new hybrid variety. Seed production of a hybrid occurs by controlling the pollination between its parents, such as hand pollination in cucurbits or de-tasseling in corn.

Indeterminate - Plant habit where vine continues to grow.

M - Is a unit of measure that equals 1,000. Seed sold by seed count is priced in multiples of 1,000. For example 5M, 10M, 25M which stands for 5,000 seeds, 10,000 seeds and 25,000 seeds

Monoecious - (cucumbers) Plant with both distinct male and female flowers.

Naked Seeded - No hull on the seed. Easier to eat than normal hulled seeds.

Open Pollination - Open pollination is pollination by insects, birds, wind, or other natural mechanisms. Seeds of open-pollinated plants will produce new generations of those plants; however, because the pollination is uncontrolled and the pollen source is unknown, open pollination may result in plants that vary widely in genetic traits.

Open Pollinated (OP) - A variety is said to be open pollinated when it is a non-hybrid variety, meaning that seed is produced via self-reproduction. Seed production of an open pollinated variety occurs using the plants natural pollination mechanism but in a controlled environment to prohibit the introduction of outside, unrelated pollen sources. These controls insure

that the open pollinated variety stays genetically pure and true to type.

Parthenocarpic - (cucumbers) Plants that set fruit without pollination.

Pelleted - Seed coating that improves the shape, size, and uniformity of raw seeds for more accurate sowing by hand and precision-sowing by machine. Pellets are made of inert materials which dissolve as they absorb moisture, allowing immediate access to oxygen for fast, uniform seedling emergence.

Pendant - Refers to how the pepper hangs on the plant.

Pithy - Fibrous, course texture.

Pungent - Refers to heat level of hot peppers; pungent = hot.

PVP - Plant Variety Protection. Seed may not be reproduced for sale without permission of the originator.

Sieve - Diameter of green bean pod.

Slip - This is a small crack that forms around the stem of melons. It is generally used as a harvest indicator. See the "Melon" section for a complete definition.

Transgenic - Genetically modified.

Uniform Ripening (UG) - Has the gene for uniform ripening of the fruit. Fruit are typically lighter green prior to ripening.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Do you offer any discounts that I would be eligible for?

Yes, we offer cash discounts on all seed orders over \$350.00. The cash discount is for orders paid for via check. You may prepay your seed order at anytime and we will add that month's discount to your credit on account. The August discount is 10% and goes down a percentage each month through April. See page 154 for more details.

Are there financing options that allow me to buy my seed now and pay at a later date?

Yes, we do offer financing through John Deere Financial. The best plan is no-interest, no-payments until harvest 2026. See page 155 for other program options and details. If you are interested in obtaining credit through John Deere Financial you may fill out the credit application on page 171.

You offer more high quality varieties than most seed dealers. How do you decide which varieties to offer?

This edition of our catalog features over 1,000 varieties in over 43 vegetable crops. We consider most of these varieties as suitable for professional and commercial growers, while a few others are included because they're popular heritage varieties.

Deciding which varieties to offer is a challenging question and there are a number of factors that are considered, including:

- What market is a variety best suited for? For the shipper or fresh market? Or wholesale or retail trade?
- Does a new variety bring a game changing improvement over current varieties? Is it higher yielding? Does it produce more desirable, consistent or marketable fruit? Does produce from the variety offer any improvements in food quality or nutrition?
- Does the variety offer the grower any benefits in managing crop issues, weeds, insects or disease?

Many of these questions are answered in the product development trials we conduct every year on our farm. Our personal experience is important and our observations at the numerous vendor trials we visit also are a factor.

The reliability of the seed supplier is also important. Do they consistently have seed supply available? And is it high quality?

I am preparing for a food safety audit. Can you help? Is Rupp Seeds GAP certified?

Yes, Rupp Seeds is GAP certified. A copy of the certificate can be found on page 151.

In recent years there have been several occurrences of food borne illness. These situations have prompted both the government and industry to respond to insure a safe food supply. Development of Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) and Good Handling Practices (GHP) for the produce industry help minimize these outbreaks, and voluntary audits help to insure the practices are defined and in use.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration's "Guide to Minimize Microbial Food Safety Hazards for Fresh Fruits and Vegetables" doesn't have specific guidance for seed companies. Even so, we recognize that many of our customers need our assurance that seeds are handled appropriately to minimize contamination.

We've consulted with food safety experts to understand what we can do to assist our customers with their audit preparations. They've recommended that we provide a Letter of Guarantee that briefly describes our practices and they've assured us this letter is acceptable in any food safety audit. We've included the letter in this catalog for your convenience. See page 150 for a copy.

Are all of your seeds treated?

Most of our seed is treated. We do have some varieties available untreated. These items are marked as untreated in the pricing tables. See the pricing table example below. Walker Deluxe is available untreated and has a 'U' at the end of the item number and the item number is red instead of black. When ordering, please put a "U" behind the item number to signify you are ordering untreated seeds. In addition, it's helpful to put "Untreated Seeds Only" on the top of your order form.

What are GMOs? What does GMO stand for? And why do they exist?

A GMO, or Genetically Modified Organism, is a plant or variety that was developed to include a desired gene or selection of genes from another plant or organism.

GMOs were developed to enable a plant with a builtin ability to resist herbicides, insects and diseases, helping farmers produce more while reducing their use of chemicals. Recent developments in science are also improving the plants water and nitrogen utilization, which enable it to produce a crop even when these nutrients are in short supply.

My customers occasionally ask me if I raise and sell GMO vegetables. Can you tell me which products in your catalog are GMO?

GMO varieties of corn, soybeans and cotton have been widely accepted by farmers in the US and internationally. GMO developments in vegetable crops, on the other hand, have been pretty limited, in large part due to the high cost of research and development for crops that aren't widely grown. Currently, the only GMO vegetables available in our catalog are sweet corn and summer squash.

Of the more than 100 varieties of sweet corn roughly 20% are GMO. These include the Performance Series, Attribute, Attribute Plus, and Attribute II varieties listed on pages 32-35.

And of the nearly 30 varieties of summer squash, only one is GMO: XPT 1832 III, on page 116.

Is there more information about GMOs that I can provide my customers if they are interested in learning more?

GMOAnswers.com is an excellent resource for anyone interested in learning more about GMOs. Visitors can ask questions and get answers from experts across a wide range of disciplines who will provide balanced, fact-based responses. These experts include conventional and organic farmers, agribusiness experts, scientists, academics, medical doctors and nutritionists from a wide range of studies.

BEANS

RUPP USE GUIDELINES

Home Garden/Farm Market varieties are considered to be high quality (gourmet). They are low in fiber and more tender. As with most home garden varieties, pods set over a longer period for extended harvest.

Shipping varieties contain fiber that slows wrinkling under long distance shipping or longer time between picking and use. They are normally less tender and have a more concentrated pod set for mechanical harvest.

PLANTING

Plant green beans in soil temperatures of 65 degrees or greater. Planting depth should be $\frac{1}{2}$ " to 1". Row spacing should be 30" for handpicking. There should be approximately 2" between plants. Some commercial growers are using 15" rows for late planted green beans that are going to be mechanically harvested.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

Weed pressure and insect pressure are the hardest things to control in green beans. If conditions are wet, diseases are more prevalent.

Harvest green beans when 50% of the beans are 3 - 4 sieve.

STORAGE

Store beans at 40 - 45°F and 95% humidity.

BEETS

PLANTING

Plant seed 1" apart and thin to 2" apart. Row spacing ranges from 15" - 24". Seed depth should be ¼" - ½" deep. Poor stands are often the result of planting too deeply or the soil's crusting after a heavy rain. The seedlings may emerge over a relatively long period of time, making a stand of different sizes and ages of seedlings.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

It is extremely important to thin beets because they are a multigerm seed meaning each seed will produce several plants. Beets that are thinned when they reach approximately 3" tall can be used as greens. Frequent and shallow cultivation is important to keep the soil loose around the growing beet to ensure uniform roots.

HARVEST

Beets can be harvested whenever they grow to the desired size. About 60 days are required for beets to reach 1½" in diameter, the size often used for cooking, pickling or canning.

STORAGE

Beets may be stored in a polyethylene bag in a refrigerator for several weeks. Cut off the tops of the beets one inch above the roots. Beets store the best at 32°F and 95% humidity. Do not freeze.








BROCCOLI

PLANTING

For spring broccoli, plant in greenhouse in flats. Sow ¼" to ½" deep. For fresh market broccoli, plant on 30" beds with trickle irrigation. On a 30" bed, plant two rows of broccoli. Plants should be 15" apart. When planting fall broccoli, count backward from the first fall frost in your area and add about 30 days from planting. This can be either started in a greenhouse or direct seeded into the field.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

Use starter fertilizer for transplants and side-dress with nitrogen fertilizer when the plants are half grown. Provide ample soil moisture, especially as the heads develop. Scout fields for aphids and cabbage worms.

HARVEST

Harvest when the head is large and firm, with a compact cluster of small flower buds. The buds should not have bright yellow flowers showing. Look for bright green or purplish-green heads. Yellow flowers and enlarged buds are signs of over-maturity.

STORAGE

Store the broccoli, unwashed, in loose or perforated plastic bags in the vegetable crisper of the refrigerator. Broccoli left unrefrigerated quickly becomes fibrous and woody.

Wet broccoli quickly becomes limp and moldy in the refrigerator—so wash it just before using. Store fresh broccoli in the refrigerator for 3 - 5 days. Old broccoli may look fine, but it develops strong undesirable flavors. It tastes best and is highest in nutritional value when storage time is brief.

BRUSSELS SPROUTS

PLANTING

Start in the greenhouse and transplant in early to mid summer, when one would start long season cabbage. Seeds should be planted 4 - 5 weeks before transplanting. Allow 90 - 100 days for plants to mature. For summer harvest, you must plant transplants of an early, heat-resistant variety in very early spring. Sprouts maturing in hot weather or under dry conditions are more likely to develop bitterness. Fall production is the most desirable in a large portion of the country. Plant 24" - 36" apart in the row and 30" - 36" apart in rows. See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

Brussels are grown much like cole crops, cabbage and broccoli.



CABBAGE

PLANTING

Transplant early cabbage soon enough that it matures before the heat of summer. Planting two or three varieties with different maturities can provide harvest over a longer period of time. Late cabbage must be started during the heat of mid-summer, but it develops its main head during the cooling weather of fall. It may be transplanted or direct seeded. Plants should be planted 12" - 24" apart depending on variety and the desired head size. Sow cabbage seeds ¼" - ½" deep.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

Use starter fertilizer when transplanting and side-dress with nitrogen after plants are half grown. Keep plants out of intense sunlight and heat of summer. Common problems are Yellow or Fusarium Wilt, as well as cabbage worms.

HARVEST

Cabbage can be harvested anytime after the head has formed. For highest yield, cut the cabbage heads when they are solid (firm to hand pressure) but before they crack or split. When heads are mature, a rain may cause heads to crack or split.

STORAGE

Fresh, uncut heads of cabbage can be stored in the refrigerator for up to two weeks. Cover loosely with a plastic bag or use perforated bags. Do not wash cabbage before storing; the extra moisture will hasten deterioration.

CARROTS

When deciding what variety of carrot to plant one must determine two things: "What is my target audience?" and "What kind of soil do I have?" Growers need to define if they are selling to fresh or storage markets. Most of the carrots available from Rupp are geared towards fresh market. If high tunnels or cold frames are used in your operation, you may want to consider carrots as part of your rotation due to their ability to resist cold weather.

There are five main types of carrots: Nantes, Chantenay, Baby, Imperator, and Danvers.

- Nantes are easily and widely adapted; straight cylindrical roots ranging 5" 7" long. They tend to have a sweet flavor and crisp texture, but have a limited storage potential. Nantes are grown in loose sandy soils or in raised beds.
- Chantenay have conical roots with broad shoulders and rounded tips. They have a rich, sweet flavor and also possess a good storage potential. They are an excellent type to grow from summer to fall and are adapted to various soil types. They usually size up well in clay soils with high organic matter content.
- Baby carrots have a root less than 5" long with a crisp texture and are frequently quite sweet when mature. They also are grown in any well drained soil and can be used to separate different types of salad greens. They tend to have limited storage potential.
- Imperator are long with a tapered root shape, stocky shoulders and strong tops. They tend to have a fibrous texture and store well. This type of carrot sizes up best in deep, sandy loam.
- Danvers have a thick rooted cylindrical shape with a yellowish core. This type is mainly used for processing, juicing, and storage.

PLANTING

Carrots can be planted in soils as cool as 40°F with the ideal temperature ranging from 50 to 75°F. They take anywhere from 7 - 21 days to emerge from the soil depending on soil temperatures. Spring carrots are planted 2 - 3 weeks before the last frost. For fall harvest, plant carrots 10 - 12 weeks before the first frost. Seed carrots $\frac{1}{4}$ " - $\frac{1}{2}$ " deep and 15" between rows. Using seed tapes or pelleted seed will help prevent over seeding.

MANAGEMENT

Soil nutrients are very important. Test the soil to check for optimal levels. Also scout for insect and fungal infestations. Root quality is best when soil temperatures are 60 - 70°F. The shape of the root is determined within the first few weeks after germination when the new plant extends its taproot deep into the soil. Sometimes growers will mix radish seed with carrot seed to help with emergence. Radishes tend to have the ability to break though soil crusting which in turn helps the carrots emerge.

HARVEST

Fresh market carrots are harvested when they are $3\!4''$ - $11\!/\!2''$ in diameter.

STORAGE

Store carrots at 32 - 34°F and at 98 - 100% humidity. Store clean carrots away from other fruits and vegetables.

CAULIFLOWER

PLANTING

Cauliflower is best started from transplants for both spring and fall crops. Do not transplant sooner than 2 - 3 weeks before the average frost free date in the spring. Cauliflower is more sensitive to the cold than its cabbage-family relatives. It is important to start cauliflower early enough that it matures before the heat of the summer, but not so early that it will be injured by the cold. Transplant autumn cauliflower and cabbage at the same time. Use starter fertilizer when transplanting. Start the transplants so that they grow actively until transplanting and never cease growth. Space transplants 18 - 24" apart in the row. Use wider spacing for fall plantings.

MANAGEMENT


Cauliflower plants should be kept growing vigorously from the seedling stage through harvest. When the heads begin to form (shows 2 to 3" of white curd at the growing point), it is ready to blanch. Tie the outer leaves together over the center of the plant to protect the head from sunburn, to keep it from turning green and developing an off-flavor. When selecting cauliflower choose varieties that are self wrapping. This will help in the blanching process.

HARVEST

The curd develops rapidly under proper growing conditions. It grows 6 - 8" in diameter and is ready to harvest within 7 - 12 days after blanching begins. The mature heads should be compact, firm, and white. Harvest the heads by cutting the main stem. Leave a few green outer leaves attached to protect the heads. Cut the heads before they become over mature and develop a coarse "ricey" appearance. Once individual florets can be seen, quality deteriorates rapidly.



HIGH TUNNEL PRODUCTION **M**



A high tunnel is a naturally heated enclosed structure that is used to grow produce while extending the growing season and controlling agronomic conditions. Also known as "hoop houses," high tunnels are typically constructed with tubular steel frames covered by plastic, and their use is rapidly gaining popularity across the Midwest and Northeast. High tunnels significantly increase the average daily temperature of the growing environment while protecting crops from wind, rain, snow, hail, insects and diseases.

A primary advantage of high tunnels over other protection systems is that they are large enough to allow crops to be grown to full maturity and allow sufficient space for cultivation, spraying, and harvesting with the tunnels intact. By extending the season, most crops grown within a high tunnel are harvested at least a month earlier or later than field grown crops, which will earn growers a premium in the marketplace.

Which crops are typically grown within a high tunnel?

Any crop where premiums for availability of early or late fresh produce is a good candidate for high tunnel production. Crops which have an early premium such as tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers or salad greens are particularly suitable, with tomatoes being the #1 crop grown in high tunnels. We recommend choosing crops with a high yield potential and high value per unit in order to recoup your investment.

How many crops can be produced within a high tunnel per year?

At least three cropping cycles are realistic for high tunnels in most climates. Two warm season and one cool season crops within a 12 month period are feasible. With intercropping (the growing of two or more crops simultaneously), the combination of crops is almost infinite.

Planning for your high tunnel

High tunnel production carries with it a modest learning curve for growers experienced with open field production. There are several key factors that should be considered when planning to grow produce in a high tunnel.

Variety Selection

Choosing the right variety for your high tunnel is important. Varieties that perform well in the open field will not

necessarily perform the same in a high tunnel. While some growers have learned how to adapt their cropping practices in order to use open field varieties in high tunnels, going this path will require some trial and error. We have highlighted several varieties in our catalog that have a proven track record in high tunnel production.

Fertility

The proper nutrient program is important since you are dealing with crops that are demanding high input to produce above average yields. If you are planting in soil, take a soil test to see what nutrients need to be added. If you're using soil bags, make sure to keep them flushed so that the salt index does not get too high.

The first priority in your fertility program is to focus on building plant structure and then concentrate on the flowering and fruit production of the plant.

Pruning and Trellising

The training process begins as soon as the plants are planted in the soil medium. Building the structure and correct biomass of the plant is essential for optimal fruit production and disease prevention. This is one of the biggest learning curves when growing in the high tunnels because it depends on crop type and variety.

For example, growers that are growing indeterminate tomatoes will trellis their tomatoes on a one-leader system, whereas determinate varieties are trellised on a two-leader system. Pruning requirements will vary by variety depending on how vigorously that variety's plant grows. Determining the correct bio-mass of the plant for optimal fruit production is an ongoing learning curve. Consult with high tunnel crop advisors, as well as your seed rep, for advice on pruning practices for certain hybrids.

Pollination

A number of vegetable crops require pollinators such as bees to be present in order for pollination to take place and fruit to set. These crops include melons, some cucumbers and squash. If wild bees are present, they may enter the high tunnel naturally. Planting cover crops such as hairy vetch, dill and alyssum around a high tunnel will help attract pollinators. If bees are not naturally present, many growers either handpollinate or purchase pollinators for release in the high tunnel. Contact Koppert Biological at 810-632-8750 or

Some cucumber varieties that are targeted for high tunnel and greenhouse production are parthenocarpic, meaning that they will set fruit without pollination, and thus don't require pollinators. All the varieties listed in the cucumber protected culture section are parthenocarpic.

Air Circulation

Circulation is vital to suppress disease. Increased disease pressure comes with stagnant and humid air, which is prevalent in a high tunnel setting. Typically, high tunnels have sides that can be rolled up, but for vertical production, fans should be installed in the upper regions of the structure to provide complete air flow movement.

Pest Management and Scouting

There are certain diseases that should be scouted for on a regular basis such as: grey leaf mold (boytritus), white mold and powdery mildew. In addition, pests such as spider mites, thrips and white flies could also be present and should be included in the scouting plan. Check with your local extension agent or crop protection advisor for products that may help you control any identified disease and pest issues.

High tunnel production is growing and crop practices continue to develop as growers gain experience with production in protected culture environments. The knowledge and experience of our staff is also continuing to develop in this area and we look forward to providing support to our customers and learn from them as we grow together.

CORN (Sweet)

PLANTING

Plant seeds 8 - 12 inches apart on 30 inch rows to achieve optimum yield. Seed depth should be $\frac{3}{4}$ " - $\frac{1}{2}$ " depending on soil conditions, and genetic type. Plant when soil temperature is 60° F plus. Planting in blocks will also help increase uniformity in pollination.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

SEEDING RATE

18,000 - 22,000 seeds per acre or one seed every 8 - 12 inches. To achieve this singulation use a finger or air seed delivery system.

MANAGEMENT

Be sure to read "Managing Insects in Sweet Corn" on page 39. For GMO and non-GMO corns, scout field every 7 days to check for insect, weed, and disease pressure. For identification of weeds, insects, and diseases consult your local extension office or view the Midwest Vegetable Production Guide.

ISOLATION

For all high quality sweet corn varieties, maintaining an isolation is required to protect the high sugar and flavor characteristics of the sweet corn as cross pollination from other types of sweet corn or different types of corn will result in starchy kernels.

SE/Synergistic types and SH2/Improved Super Sweet types should be isolated both from each other <u>and</u> from other types of corn including field corn, popcorn, and ornamental corn.

An isolation can be achieved either by distance or by a difference in maturity. Preferable isolations would require 700 - 1000 feet distance from other corns, or 10 - 14 days between pollination.

RELATIVE MATURITY

Sweet corn maturities are publicized as days to relative maturity. This information comes from supplier data, as well as our trial observations in the Midwest. Prolonged excessive heat or cool temperatures can cause maturity dates to fluctuate to some degree . Monitor your crop through the growing season in order to pick at optimum freshness.

HARVEST

Harvest sweet corn when the end kernels of the ear feel developed. Approximately 21 - 25 days after half silk. Sample sweet corn to ensure quality.

STORAGE

Pre-cool cob temperature to 50°F. After pre-cooling store at 34°F and 95% humidity.

2025 SWEET CORN TRIAL REPORT

2025 was no different than years past. It had its own set of challenges. However, it was still educational for me as the Product Development Lead. As I reflect, on this past sweet corn season one thing that sticks out is extremes. Extremely wet and extremely dry for us on the trial farm. This year, I had a crash course on what too much rain does to herbicides and having to stay on top of weed control when your "Plan A" fails. The other thing that I observed as well is you can grow nice corn on very little rain. My last planting (July 6) only had 2.7" of rain fall.

In the short season Sh2 corn's, I have come to enjoy Bolt. However, it is a corn that a grower would only use once or twice in the early slot. Crookham is releasing one this year called Dash. We have trialed this as an experimental number for three years and have been impressed with it. I also got to see this variety in another location, and it was impressive. Looking at old notes, George Wonacott, before he passed, called this one the Bolt killer in one of our meetings. For the growers who have come to love Kickoff, IFSI is working at bringing one out called Kick-Start. We hope that we can get this out and see how it preforms across our footprint as a company.

As for consistent performers, I don't think you could go wrong with any of the grower preferred varieties. For rain gaps, I am still excited about Solstice and Signature. Eden, for early white corn, checks all the boxes. People ask what I would put up against Kate, and my answer is aways Nirvana or Xanadu - especially if you don't want to have a sore shoulder when you're done picking. Cosmic continues to impress me, and I encourage growers to use it for their late plantings because of its disease tolerance.

If you are still growing Synergistic corn, we picked up Evolution from Seneca. I think growers will come to like this one. Let us know how you enjoy it if you decide to put it in your lineup.

The most exciting thing this year was preforming a "stress wheel" on some of our commercial hybrids. It was very exciting to see how the different corns performed under a really high population. It was amazing to see how a few hybrids did not change ear size from 43,000 seeds per acre to 13,500 seeds per acre. I find it amazing how plants can adapt to stress and weather! It is one of the joys I believe I share with you as growers.

Sweet Corn Quick Guide

Sweet corn is one of the most popular vegetables grown in the United States. Sweet corn hybrids, like many vegetable varieties, have seen improvements that enhance eating quality in the areas of sugar content, flavor, tenderness and appearance. Commercial growers also experience benefits of these improved hybrids with higher yields, disease resistance, better plant structure, insect and herbicide resistance, etc.

Genetic Types

Producing and preserving the eating quality potential of the hybrids is a key factor for the grower's success in his market. Knowing the genetic type of each hybrid is essential as the grower prepares a cropping plan. Each genetic type has some risks of cross pollination with other types, which can negatively impact eating quality in the crop produced. Maintaining an isolation between types or selecting hybrids within compatible genetic type groups will ensure that the eating quality of each hybrid has been preserved.

Several of these types are related, so from a variety selection and crop planning perspective, we view them as three genetic type groups. Each group has slightly different recommendations for the other types they need to be isolated from. *Please see the genetic type groups to the right for more information on the characteristics of each group and its isolation requirements.*

Isolation

For all high quality sweet corn varieties, maintaining an isolation is required to protect the high sugar and flavor characteristics of the sweet corn as cross pollination from other types of sweet corn or different types of corn will result in starchy kernels.

SE/Synergistic types and SH2/Improved Super Sweet types should always be isolated both from each other <u>and</u> from other types of corn including field corn, popcorn, and ornamental corn.

An isolation can be achieved either by distance or by a difference in maturity. Preferable isolations would require 700 - 1000 feet distance from other corns, or 10 - 14 days between pollination.

When to Plant

We all want to get sweet corn in the ground as soon as possible. However, planting sweet corn in cold soil often leads to poor germination and vigor - leading to a disappointing sweet corn harvest.

Below is a general guide when to plant sweet corn according to **SOIL TEMPERATURE**.

60° or colder -- DON'T PLANT
60° - 70° -- DELAY PLANTING
70° or warmer -- READY TO PLANT

For detailed soil temperature information, see page 149.

SU NORMAL

- Traditional sweet corn genotype (SU gene)
- Exceptional seed vigor and germination
- Strong, old fashion corn flavor
- One day window where sugars are at their peak before converting to starch

For best flavor, isolate from SH2 and Improved Super Sweet types and dent corn, popcorn, and ornamental corn.

SE

- Sugary enhancer (SE) gene
- Sweetness, flavor, and texture are improved over SU types
- Three day window where sugars are at their peak before converting to starch
- Typically used for freezing

SYNERGISTIC

- Tender kernels with higher sugars than SE
- Longer shelf life than SE
- Approximately five days from when sugars are at their peak before converting to starch
- Great for local and roadside markets seeking the balance between that old fashion flavor and the high sugar corns.

For best flavor, isolate from SU, SH2, and Improved Super Sweet types and also dent corn, popcorn, and ornamental corn

SH2 SH2 EXTRA SWEET

- Shrunken (SH2) gene raises the sugar levels and field holding ability.
- Increased shelf life improves ease of distribution
- Harder kernel gives a snap bite
- Less damage during harvest
- Ten day window where sugars are at their peak before converting to starch
- Needs warmer soils (65° F or higher) for germination

IMPROVED SUPER SWEETS

- A perfect blend of tender SE type kernel with the high sugar flavors of SH2
- Ten day window where sugars are at their peak before converting to starch
- Needs warmer soils (65° F or higher) for germination

MANAGING INSECTS IN SWEET CORN

Corn Ear Worm is the greatest threat to sweet corn growers across the Midwest and Northeast - creating the potential for our customers to lose profits. We have heard reports from growers and university researchers that not all insecticides are created equal and do not provide adequate control that is needed. Labels often do not communicate its effectiveness on potential resistant insect populations. Each growing region may have varying degrees of resistance. It is best to contact local extension personnel or chemical retailers to see what works best in your growing region. It is a best management practice to always rotate modes of actions.

We have put together a "Sweet Corn Growing Guide" to help growers monitor and combat these profit robbing insects. We also have a helpful section titled "Insect Scouting Resources" (below, right). Please feel free to call the office (800-700-1199) to request your copy of our "Sweet Corn Growing Guide" to find other helpful tips and ways to control other Lepidoptera that can cause severe damage to sweet corn such as: European corn borer, fall armyworm and Western bean cut worm.

MONITORING EUROPEAN CORN BORER AND CORN EARWORM

One of the keys to successfully managing European corn borers and corn earworms on sweet corn is to determine when the insects are active. European corn borers can be monitored effectively with blacklight traps and field observations, and corn earworms can be monitored with pheromone traps. When moths are being caught in the traps, it means they are laying eggs.

Corn borer eggs are laid on leaves, usually on the undersides, in the region of the ear. Larvae feed on the leaves and later may migrate to the ears (if present).

Corn earworm moths lay their eggs directly on green silks. The larvae that hatch from those eggs will follow the silks down into the tips of the ears.

Because these two insects' egg laying behavior differ, control strategies also differ. Corn borers can be controlled by spraying during the late whorl, tasselling, and silking stages. The migrating larvae should contact a lethal dose of insecticide while moving to the ear zone. Corn earworms must be controlled by directing sprays at the silks so larvae will immediately contact the insecticide after hatching.

For corn borers, treat during the late whorl stage if 20 percent or more of the plants show larval feeding. The presence of large numbers of moths in light traps also justifies treatment. One application during the late whorl stage, followed by additional treatments every five days up until seven days of harvest, usually provides adequate control.

For corn earworms, treatment is justified if fresh green silks are present and moths are being caught in pheromone traps. In general, the higher the moth catches, the shorter the interval between sprays. If fewer than five moths are being caught per night, a five-day spray interval should be adequate. As moth catches approach 50 to 100 per night, a two- to three-day spray interval would be more appropriate. Determining the spray

interval exactly depends on many factors, including how much damage you can tolerate, the crop's value, and the cost and effectiveness of the insecticide. Stop treating for corn earworms when 90 percent of the silks are brown.

Obviously, growers should not treat separately for these two pests. Some of the insecticides recommended here are effective against both species. Choose insecticides that are more effective against the particular pest that is most prevalent at the time of application. If both pests are present, choose an insecticide that will adequately control both.

INSECT PROTECTED VARIETIES

Insect protected sweet corn varieties such as Syngenta's Attribute, Attribute Plus, and Attribute II Insect Protected corn and the Performance Series from Seminis should be considered as they will allow the grower to decrease the number of sprays that need to be applied. While these products have a built in resistance to some insects, they do not eliminate the need for insect scouting and occasional spraying. Using these varieties in combination with a reduced spray program will lead to great results. The extra investment in seed cost pays off in reduced spray and fuel costs as well as less time in the fields, making insect protected varieties an interesting alternative.

EATING QUALITY

No popcorn varieties are hulless. Eating quality is a measurement of flavor, kernel tenderness and hulls that are thin and break and disperse during popping. Thicker hulled hybrids retain the hull in the popped product and tend to remain in your teeth after eating. Factors influencing popcorn quality include kernel moisture and expansion ratio, processing procedures, home storage and handling. Good popcorn should provide at least 98% popped kernels with well under 2% unpopped kernels. Proper care at the processing level helps to assure this. Popcorn is rated Good to Poor.

EXPANSION

Refers to the increase in volume of unpopped corn after it is popped. To illustrate, if a given volume of unpopped corn expanded to a 40 rating when popped, the volume increase was 40 times. All data is collected on the standard test popper.

LODGING

The percentage of stalks broken below the ear at harvest time.

MUSHROOM SHAPE

The popped shape that is the most desirable for manufacturing caramel corn etc. due to tougher more durable shape after popping. Always less desirable as eating corn.

YIELD

Pounds of shelled corn adjusted to 13.5% moisture.

STORAGE

To maintain the best quality popcorn, store at 13 - 14.5% moisture content.































PLANTING

Direct seed $\frac{1}{2}$ " - 1" soils with 60°F+ temperatures. Row spacing should range from 30" - 36" apart. Space plants 12" apart in the row.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

Scout fields weekly to make sure weed, insect, and disease pressure are kept in check.

HARVEST

Harvest every other day. Slicing cucumbers should be picked when diameter is approximately 2". Cucumbers should be approximately 7 - 8" long and have a smooth surface. Pickling cucumbers should be 3" long by 1" wide when ready to pick.

STORAGE

Store at 50 - 55° F and 90 - 95% humidity to ensure long shelf life.





FLOWERS

SITE SELECTION

Sunflowers (cut) and Zinnias do best in areas that receive full sun and planted in well-drained soil rich in organic matter with a pH of 6.0–6.8 but can tolerate soils slightly out of this range. Grow as an annual in gardens or field settings. Container grown is not recommended for the sunflowers or Zinnias.

PLANTING

The most common method of growing sunflowers or Zinnias is to direct seed in a field or garden. Prepare a seed bed at least 2 weeks before sowing seed, amend soil with compost or nutrients as you would for any typical vegetable crop. Using the stale seedbed technique, work soil one additional time immediately before planting to limit emerged seedlings and have a fresh seedbed.

For Sunflowers: Sow seeds in rows 1" deep with 4-6" between seeds. Space your rows 12" to 36" apart. Cover with fine soil and firm soil lightly to have good contact with seed & soil. Water lightly if needed to aid in germination. Mechanical seeders can be used to direct sow sunflower seeds. Planters ranging from a single row push seeder to a 12-row air planter are being used successfully. When using mechanical seeders, check and adjust the seeder so seeding depth is 1" deep and seed is placed firmly in the seed trench for placement.

For Zinnias: Sow seeds either in single shallow rows, 5-6 seeds every 12", or individual hills of 3-4 seeds about ¼" to ½" deep. Cover with fine soil and firm soil lightly to have good contact with seed and soil. Water lightly to aid soil moisture if needed to aid in germination. Once emerged thin to 3 seedlings per foot. Pinch out the very first center bud. This will promote lateral branching resulting in many more flowers and generally longer stems.

CUT FLOWERS ALL SEASON LONG

Planting sunflowers every 7-10 days will help ensure a steady supply of excellent quality fresh cut flowers for your customers. Once flower petals open the peak flower quality will only last about of 5-7 days depending on temperatures. Manage a consistent availability of cut flowers for your customers by developing a planting schedule based on maturity dates and average daily temperatures.

HARVEST

Harvest blooms either mid-morning or late evening. Using a sharp sheer, cut stems to desired length while maintaining enough residual plant to generate more blooms. Remove excess foliage and place stems in cool water. Store or display zinnias out of the direct sunlight to extend vase life. Stems will generally last for 5-7 days. It is recommended to use a flower food. Sanitize cutting tools and flower buckets to keep fungi and bacteria at a minimum which will extend cut flowers vase life. Deadhead spent and unused blooms while cutting flowers, this will keep plants cleaner, deter disease from forming in the unwanted blooms and promote branching and additional blooms.



GOURDS

PLANTING

Direct seed in soils that are above 70° F. Plant gourds 1/2" - 1" deep. For a general rule of thumb, plant seed the depth of three times the thickness of the seed. Plant spacing varies depending on fruit size. For small and miniature gourds plant at approximately 5 - 10 sq. ft. per plant. For large gourds plant them at 30 sq. ft. per plant.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

Scout fields every 7 days to ensure crop health. Look for insect, weed, and disease pressure. The first three weeks focus on weeds and insect pressure. Then focus on disease pressure. For weed, insect, and disease identification and treatments consult the Midwest Vegetable Production Guide:

www.ruppseeds.com/MVPG or your local extension. Place pollinators in field to ensure maximum fruit set.

HARVEST

Harvest when fruit have developed deep vibrant color or when plants start to die down. Clean gourds of dirt, then dip them in a 5% chlorine solution to ensure long shelf life.

STORAGE

Place gourds in a dry place that will have good air circulation to prevent rotting.





LETTUCE

PLANTING

Raw Seed Lettuce: Prep the ground so the soil is as fine and loose as possible. Make a seed trench with tines on garden rake. Lightly sprinkle seed in every other trench. Seed should be roughly 1/8"- ¼" deep. Lightly cover the seed with fine soil.

Pelleted Lettuce: Seed in trays 3-4 weeks prior to transplanting. Direct seed into field planting at a depth of 1/8 inch. Seed or transplant lettuce at 10-12" apart in row and 10-12" between rows.

Optimal germination is 50-72 degrees and should sprout in 7-10 days. Lettuce seed will go dormant if soil temperature does get too high.

MANAGEMENT

Growing on white plastic mulch is highly recommended to help keep weeds under control. Leaf head lettuce, Butterhead, and Romaine are the easiest types to grow and sell for fresh markets or roadside stands. Typically, growers cut lettuce in the cool of the morning or evening prior to market day. Cut at the base of the plant and cool at 40 degrees in a high humidity environment. If lettuce wilts, place stems in fresh water in the refrigerator.

HARVEST


Lettuce is an easy crop to add to an early farmers market or fall market. Lettuce can be easily sold alongside many other crops such as beets, radishes, pak-choi, carrots, and spinach. Another trick of the trade is selling a mix of lettuce that is unique to your market or stand. Growers can add different colored lettuce and leaf types or even mustards, or other micro greens to spice up their signature mix. We see growers typically trying to do 2:1 ratio of green to red lettuce.

STORAGE

Leafy greens can be stored close to 32°F. At this temperature, they can be held for 10 - 14 days.



PLANTING

When direct seeding plant $\frac{1}{2}$ " - 1" deep. Soil temperature should be 75 - 85°F. Five to six feet is the recommended row spacing with 18 - 24 inches between plants. If starting with transplants sow 3 - 5 weeks prior to planting outside.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

To ensure high yield place pollinators near fields. A melon needs to be visited by a bee three times to ensure proper pollination. Scout every seven days for weed, insect, and disease pressure. Contact your local extension agent or consult the Midwest Vegetable Production Guide for identification and treatment options.

HARVEST

Harvest 30 - 35 days after pollination. If shipping, pick at half slip. When picking for fresh market, pick at ¾ to full slip. Wash fruit in peroxyacetic acid (peroxide and acetic acid), as a non-chlorine sanitizing option.

STORAGE

Cool to at least 70°F and at 95% humidity. Shelf life is based on storage temperature. Do not cool below 32°F.


Harvest Indicator (Slip): Slip is defined as a small crack that forms around the stem. Typically, when harvesting a cantaloupe and consuming it within a few days a full slip melon is your best choice, but the shelf life is limited. If you desire to pick less often and store the cantaloupe in a cooler, you might want to consider a half slip melon. You will still get good flavor, good sugar, and a firm texture. The third stage would be clipping. At this stage, the brix's have fully developed and fruit are firm and soften as they are stored. A clipped melon does not mean it is of lower quality.



ONIONS

PLANTING

Onions are mostly direct seeded in the field, although some are transplanted as seedlings or sets. Transplants are sometimes used to improve bulb size, as well as to hasten maturity, or to avoid infection by some plant diseases, but this method of crop establishment is more expensive. Planting occurs from late March through early May. Betweenrow spacing varies considerably depending upon weed and foliar disease management, seeder capability, and harvesting equipment. In-row spacing also varies depending upon variety, desired bulb size, between row spacing, soil type, and other management considerations.

Bunching Onions - Direct seed in spring when the soil reaches 50° F. Plant seed $\frac{1}{2}$ " deep and approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ " apart.

Bulb Onions/Short Day - Typically short day onions are direct seeded in the southern region of the United States. In order to grow short day onions in the northern region of the United States, the seed has to be sown in greenhouses and then transplanted into the field. Use pelleted seed if direct seeding to help achieve better singulation.

Bulb Onions/Intermediate Day - Direct seed intermediate day onions as soon as soil allows in April or early May. Sow seed 2" apart and thin to 3 - 4" apart for larger onions. Seeding depth should be approximately ¼" deep. If transplanting seed in flats in late February to mid March, tops may be clipped to 5" tall. Use pelleted seed if direct seeding to help achieve better singulation.

Bulb Onions/Long Day - Direct seed long day onions as soon as soil allows in April or early May. Sow seed 2" apart and thin to 3 - 4" apart for larger onions. Seeding depth should be approximately ¼" deep. If transplanting seed in flats in late February to mid March, tops may be clipped to 5" tall. Use pelleted seed if direct seeding to help achieve better singulation. Plant long day onions in the northern latitudes.

MANAGEMENT


Keep onions well weeded with shallow cultivation. Onions are shallow rooted and grow best in moist soil; irrigation may be required. Keep direct seeded onions away from onion sets because onion sets are more prone to disease. Long day onions should be planted in northern latitudes because of daylight requirements for bulbing.

HARVEST

Onions are ready to harvest when tops approximately have 50 - 75% fallen over and the skins have dried. Pull the bulbs by hand or use equipment such as a potato digger or undercutter to cut the roots and lift the bulbs. Wait until all the leaves are dead and dry. It is likely the outer skins will loosen. Pulling onions too green will make them difficult to cure and will affect storing them. Harvest when the weather is dry.

STORAGE


Cure onions at 65 - 85°F at 70% humidity. Curing decreases the incidence of neck rot, reduces water loss during storage, prevents microbial infection, and is desirable for development of good scale color. Curing can be done in the field, preferably when the weather is warm and dry. If it rains let them dry fully before handling. A greenhouse or hoophouse also provides good conditions for curing. Temperatures in the 80's will enhance the bronze color in the skins. Sunshine is good as long as it is not too hot. Extreme sun can produce sunscald. Store onions out of the sun; exposure to light after curing will induce greening of outer scales. Optimum temperature for long term storage of onions is 32°F with 65 - 70% humidity. It is important to cool them down slowly. Using cool late summer and fall temperatures works great to cool onions down slowly.

Sow in the greenhouse 7 - 9 weeks before desired planting date. Allow plants to harden 7 days before transplanting. Plant transplants halfway between rootball and bottom leaves. This will help prevent lodging.

PEPPERS (Hot)

ANAHEIM (Hatch - New Mexican chili)

Fruit range from 4 - 12" long and 2" wide, green to red at maturity, but also may be yellow, orange to brown. Varieties range from sweet to hot. Use green as fresh, canned or frozen. Mature are usually dried and ground into chili powder or paprika if sweet. Also used in salsas.

ANCHO (Poblano)

The fruit are heart shaped, pointed, thin walled with an indented stem attachment. Immature fruit are dark green with mature fruit being either red or brown. Fruit are 3 - 4" long and about 2" wide and are mildly pungent. The pepper of choice to make chili rellenos.

CAYENNE

Mature red fruit are 5 - 10" long and wrinkled. Irregular in shape, highly pungent, often used as dried, ground powder. Also used fresh in salads, sauces and dishes.

CHERRY

Like the name suggests, round or slightly flattened, green to red, hot or sweet. Similar use to wax pepper.

HABANERO (Habanero-Scotch Bonnet-Bahamian-Jamacian-Ghost) In this species, diversity is enormous. Popular in Jamaica, Yucatan and Brazil. Very, very hot and persistent, but aromatic. Fruit are 1 - 2½" long and 1 - 2" wide. Green to variable mature colors of yellow, orange, red or white. Use dried as a spice, fresh or processed. Plant starts slower than other pepper types. Ghost peppers are subconical to conical shape measuring 2.5 to 3.5 inches in length. They are approximately three times hotter than typical habaneros. Red is the most common color at maturity, with orange, yellow and chocolate as rarer varieties.

JALAPEÑO

Fruit are thick walled, conical shaped, dark green when immature turning red at maturity and most cultivars are highly pungent. Fruit may show cracking or corkiness which is a desirable trait in Mexico. Length vary widely. Use canned, pickled, salsas or fresh. When dried, by smoking, they are called chipotle.

ORNAMENTALS

Peppers classified as ornamentals do not carry a characteristic that makes them in-edible. They are individuals from the many groups previously listed that happen to have leaves and fruit that are particularly attractive and give them ornamental value.

PASILLA

Pod length is 6 - 12" long and 1 - 2" wide. Fruit color is dark green, turning brown at maturity. Usually dried before use in moles and salsas.

RED CHIL

Fruit are 21/2" long by 1/2" wide, green when immature changing to red at maturity. Fruit have thin walls, taper to a point and are used for drying, processing and sauce. Hot!

SERRANO

Fruit are $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide and 2 - 3" long. Medium walls and shaped similar to Jalapeño and is the pepper of choice in Salsa Verde and other southwestern relishes.

THAI HOT

Green fruit to red at maturity, very hot, tiny 3/8" wide by 1" long fruit. Popular in oriental markets.

WAX

Yellow when immature, orange-red at maturity. Can be pungent or non-pungent. Vary from 2 - 8" long and about 2" wide. Use pickled or fresh in salads and relishes.







PUMPKINS

PLANTING

Plant pumpkins ½" - 1" deep. For a general rule of thumb plant seed the depth of three times the thickness of the seed. Plant spacing varies depending on fruit size. If planting a large pumpkin give plant approximately 72 sq. ft. of space. Medium sized pumpkins require 30 sq. ft. of space. Pie pumpkins require 24 - 30 sq. ft. of space. Miniature pumpkins require 10 - 24 sq. ft. of space. See the "Pumpkin Planting/ Harvesting Timing Chart" on page 101) and the "Spacing Chart" (below) for more details.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

Scout fields every 7 days to ensure crop health. Look for insect, weed, and disease pressure. The first three weeks focus on weeds and insect pressure. Then focus on disease pressure. For weed, insect, and disease identification and treatments consult the Midwest Vegetable Production

www.ruppseeds.com/MVPG or your local extension. Place pollinators in field to ensure maximum fruit set.

HARVEST

Harvest when fruit has developed deep color. Handles will appear dry. Cut handles with shears to protect handles from being broken off.

STORAGE

Clean fruit of dirt and wash in 5% chlorine solution. Let air dry and cure for 10 - 12 days. Make sure air is able to circulate around fruit. It is important to keep fruit dry.

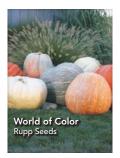
PLANT SPACING

Each variety or type of pumpkin has an optimum plant spacing for its best performance. If plants are too close, stress and competition can decrease fruit size and possibly reduce the number of female flowers. Under extreme stress, tight spacing may eliminate the crop entirely.

- Optimum spacing for maximum yield, especially for jack-olantern pumpkins, will not necessarily be the best spacing for large fruit size. For large fruit, we would suggest reducing plant density to the next recommended plant population.
- Accurate plant spacing will be an equal opportunity environment for every plant.
- Suggested populations are for final plant stands.
- To achieve ideal plant populations it is necessary to either overplant and hand thin or to plant according to recommendations and hand plant later to fill skips.
- Seed corn maggots, wire worms, mice and birds, floods or lack of rain are all common problems that affect accurate stand establishment.

PUMPKIN PLANTING/HARVESTING TIMING CHART

Pumpkin growers who are planting multiple varieties need to consider multiple planting dates so that they can harvest their crop at its peak. The planting date plus the maturity of the variety should equal the potential harvest date. Keep in mind that higher or lower than average heat and sunlight may also impact the development of the crop by decreasing or increasing its maturity. Use this chart to align pumpkin variety maturity with your harvest date to schedule planting.

Pumpkin quality will be the best when harvested nearest to the variety's actual maturity.

First, select the maturity of the variety you are using, then pick the date you would like your pumpkins to look the freshest (nice green handle). The required planting date will be at the top of the column.

For example; if you are planting Gold Medal (95 day) and you want them to look their freshest on September 15th, you will want to plant on June 15. However, if you are planting Gold Rush (120 day) and you also want them to look their freshest on September 15th, you will want to plant on May 15.













RUPP'S PUMPKIN GROWING TIPS FOR SUCCESS

CROP ROTATION

I strongly recommend that growers NOT plant pumpkins in the same field in consecutive years and would suggest that waiting a minimum of three years between pumpkin crops would be best. If you have adequate acreage, I would even prefer that you wait 5 to 7 years before raising another pumpkin crop in that same field. This helps to reduce and possibly even prevent soil diseases and pest infestations. When possible, raising pumpkins after wheat is a great option. Rotating pumpkins in after corn and soybeans can increase the likelihood of higher rootworm populations and phytophthora, which will be detrimental to the crop.

PLANT SPACING

Correct plant spacing is very important and will vary by product. Planting a full vine variety too close can increase disease pressure. Diseases like powdery mildew or fruit rot can become more prevalent when the vine foliage does not have adequate space for air movement to aid in removing moisture in the plant canopy. Planting too closely will also affect fruit size and yield by holding too much heat in the field and restricting the ability for pollinators to do their job. It also impedes insecticide and fungicide effectiveness by restricting spray penetration.

PEST CONTROL

The biggest problem I hear about concerning insect and disease control is when growers are using the same product in repeated applications. Rotate your insecticide and fungicides based on their mode of action and NOT just brand name or active ingredient. Remember scouting is one of your best tools. For chemical recommendations, consult the Midwest Vegetable Production Guide www.ruppseeds.com/MVPG.

POLLINATION

Pollinators can have a significant effect on pumpkin yield. I have heard it can take 14-17 visits by a pollinator (bees, etc.) in order for a flower to be fully

pollinated. Scout your fields in the morning and if you don't see or hear bees, I recommend bringing in 1 hive of bees per acre.

VARIETY CHOICE

Make sure you know your target market before selecting which hybrids you want to grow. Most retail markets will accept a wide range of sizes, shapes and colors, where wholesale markets tend to have more specific requirements around bin count, size, shape, color and handle.

FIELD LOCATION

Vine crops typically perform better on well-drained sandy soils. The heavier the soils, the greater the importance of drainage. When a pumpkin is ripe, any rain that gets taken up by the plant is deposited into the seed cavity, which may lead to and even speed up the process of fruit rot.

BIOLOGICS

Beneficial bacteria in the soil, or added at planting time, will colonize on the roots and improve root and plant health which will help the plant handle stress (i.e. – drought or excessive water) later in the season.

PLANTING TIMING

This is a topic we discuss often as we continue to develop new varieties. If you are currently growing a late maturing variety and choose to also plant an early variety, DO NOT plant them on the same day. The early variety usually ripens way too early for your market and will likely rot before you harvest. We have a very handy "Pumpkin Planting/Harvesting Timing Chart" on page 101 to assist you with your planting dates.

FERTILITY

Soil testing can't be emphasized enough. Know what is already in your soil, and what you need to add. For invaluable information on this, see the Midwest Vegetable Production Guide link listed under Pest Control.

PLANTING

Direct seed into field. Plant 1/2" - 3/4" deep. Row spacing should range from 36" - 60" apart. In row spacing ranges from 18" - 24".

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

Scout fields every 7 days. Inspect for weeds, insect, and disease infestation.

HARVEST

Harvest every other day. Fruit should be 7 - 8" in length and 1 - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter. Another way to determine harvestablity is to harvest when blossom has wilted.

STORAGE

Store at 40 - 50°F and at 95% humidity.

SQUASH (Winter)

PLANTING

Plant seeds $\frac{1}{2}$ " - $\frac{3}{4}$ " deep. Plant spacing varies depending on vine type. Bush type plants should be planted closer and vine types should be planted farther apart. Squash need to have approximately 25 - 30 sq. ft. See the Winter Squash Planting / Harvest Timing chart on page 121 for additional information.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

Scout every 7 days for insect, weed, and disease pressure. Fruit will tend to decrease in size the farther south a crop is planted and increase in size the farther north it is planted. Size is relative to day length.

HARVEST

Cut off the vine to keep peduncle. Wash in 5% chlorine solution and pat dry. Let cure for 10 days. Keep fruit dry to prevent spoilage. Allow air to circulate around fruit.

STORAGE

Store at 45 - 55° F and humidity level of 50 - 60%. Keep fruit dry and allow air to circulate around fruit.

PLANT SPACING

Each variety or type of squash has an optimum plant spacing for its best performance. If plants are too close, stress and competition can decrease fruit size and possibly even reduce the number of female flowers. Under extreme stress, tight spacing may eliminate the crop entirely.

- Accurate plant spacing will be an equal opportunity environment for every plant.
- Suggested populations are for final plant stands.
- To achieve ideal plant populations it is necessary to either overplant and hand thin or to plant according to recommendations and hand plant later to fill skips.
- Seed corn maggots, wire worms, mice and birds, floods or lack of rain are all common problems that effect accurate stand establishment.



WINTER SQUASH PLANTING/HARVESTING TIMING CHART

Winter squash growers who are planting multiple varieties need to consider multiple planting dates so that they can harvest their crop at its peak. The planting date plus the maturity of the variety should equal the potential harvest date. Keep in mind that higher or lower than average heat and sunlight may also impact the development of the crop by decreasing or increasing its maturity. Use the following chart to align your squash variety maturity with your desired harvest date to schedule planting.







PLANTING

Sow in greenhouse 4 - 6 weeks before desired planting date. Allow plants to adjust to field conditions for 48 hours before transplanting. Plant transplants up to 6 inches deep.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

Staking and pruning plants are an important management practice. Staking and pruning allows the plant to concentrate on fruit development and also ensures less damage when harvesting fruit. Staking also keeps fruit from setting on the ground. Grow plants on raised beds with drip irrigation. Scout weekly to ensure crop quality. Consult Midwest Vegetable Production Guide on identification and treatment.














WATERMELON

(Seeded)

PLANTING

Start in the greenhouse and allow 28 - 35 days to get plants ready to transplant. Excessive water during germination must be avoided. Water transplant growing medium well and allow excess moisture to drain and moisture to stabilize for 24 - 48 hours. Bring medium temperature to 80 - 95°F before seeding. Seedcoat adherence to cotyledons may be virtually eliminated by orienting the seed in transplant trays with the pointed end up at a 45° to 90° angle. Plant transplants 6 - 12 feet apart with 36" between plants.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

Scout fields every 7 days to monitor weed, insect, and disease pressure. Place pollinating insects near the field to ensure proper pollination. Water only if necessary. Do not over-water.

HARVEST

Ripeness is indicated by a cream to slight yellowing of the white background color of the part of the melon that rests on the ground. Drying of the stem tendril nearest the attachment point of the watermelon and green color tone of the rind are also indicators of ripeness but these vary with cultivar. Melons should be cut from the vine rather than pulled, twisted, or broken off.

STORAGE

Store at 50 - 60°F and at a humidity level of 90 - 95%. This will ensure a long shelf life.







PLANTING

Start in the greenhouse. Allow 28 - 35 days to get plants ready to transplant. Excessive water during germination must be avoided. Water transplant growing medium well and allow excess moisture to drain and moisture to stabilize for 24 - 48 hours. Bring medium temperature to 80 - 95°F before seeding. Seedcoat adherence to cotyledons may be virtually eliminated by orienting the seed in transplant trays with the pointed end up at a 45° to 90° angle. Plant transplants 6 - 12 feet apart with 36" between plants.

As a general rule, direct field seeding of the pollenizer variety should be done on the same day the triploid seed is planted in the greenhouse. Small-fruited, icebox varieties usually flower earlier than standard watermelon varieties. If icebox varieties are to be used as the pollenizer, then direct seeding should be delayed a week to ten days. The diploid icebox pollenizer variety will frequently set fruit and stop producing male blossoms while the triploid variety is still producing female blossoms. Growers may make a second planting of a pollenizer 2 - 3 weeks after the initial planting to provide pollen for the late-developing female blossoms on the triploid variety. No consistent differences among any standard and icebox types in effectiveness of pollination have been noted. Icebox varieties used as pollenizers result in high early yields; standard varieties used as pollenizers result in high total yields.

See "Germination Chart" on page 149 for additional information on germination rate and days to germination at various soil temperatures.

MANAGEMENT

For successful seedless watermelon production, an adequate bee population is especially important to transfer the pollen from the pollenizer variety to the seedless variety (seedless watermelons do not produce pollen). The pollenizer variety is normally planted in alternate, or every third row to ensure adequate pollen movement by the bees. At least eight visits to an individual flower of the seedless variety are necessary for adequate hormonal stimulation for normal fruit development. Scout fields very 7 days to monitor weed, insect, and disease pressure.

HARVEST

Ripeness is indicated by a cream to slight yellowing of the white background color of the part of the melon that rests on the ground. Drying of the stem tendril nearest the attachment point of the watermelon and green color tone of the rind are also indicators of ripeness but these vary with cultivar. Melons should be cut from the vine rather than pulled, twisted, or broken off.

STORAGE

Store at $50 - 60^{\circ}F$ and at a humidity level of 90 - 95%. This will ensure a long shelf life.







THE IMPORTANCE OF SOIL TESTING

Soil testing is an essential part of growing healthy vegetables. A soil test can provide information about the nutrient levels and pH of your soil. This can help determine what amendments are needed to create optimal growing conditions.

Soil testing is important for a number of reasons. First, it helps to ensure that your plants are getting the needed nutrients and in the correct amounts. Different plants require different nutrients in different amounts. It's important to know what nutrients are available in your soil so you can supplement the soil accordingly.

Second, testing can help identify any potential concerns with your soil. For example, a soil test could reveal problems with your soil's pH, salinity, or detect other concerns that could impact plant growth. By identifying these problems early on, you can take action to give your vegetables the best opportunity to thrive.

Third, soil testing can help to improve the quality of your vegetables. Plants that are grown in nutrient-rich soil are more likely to be healthy and productive. Healthy plants are also more resistant to pests and diseases.

To test your vegetable soil, collect a sample from your field and submit it to a local county extension office or a private soil testing laboratory. It is our recommendation that you do not use a home test as the results may not be as thorough as a soil test sent to the extension office or private laboratory.

Once you have your soil test results, use them to develop a fertilization plan for your vegetables. Your local county extension office may be able to help with this.

NOTICE, WAIVER and COMPLETE RELEASE AGREEMENT

Bacterial Fruit Blotch (BFB) and Gummy Stem Blight (GSB) are serious diseases that have become significant risk factors in many areas where watermelons are grown. The Pathogens causing these diseases (Acidovorax avenae subsp. citrulli for BFB and Didymella bryoniae for GSB), and other watermelon diseases, can be introduced into a field by infested seed, infected transplants, volunteer watermelons, mechanical means, or natural spread from alternate hosts, or may already be present in the field on crop debris or in the soil. Notwithstanding the above, Rupp Seeds cannot and does not guarantee or warrant that such tests are totally conclusive nor that the seeds are free of the Pathogens and, further, cannot and does not guarantee or warrant that the Pathogens may not be introduced to such seeds and/or watermelon plants from outside sources at a later time.

GROWER'S RELEASE OF ALL LIABILITY FOR BACTERIAL FRUIT BLOTCH.

Acknowledging the above, Grower still wishes to purchase watermelon seeds, and Grower is willing to assume all risks of loss associated with these Pathogens. Accordingly, Grower hereby fully and unconditionally releases Rupp Seeds and its suppliers from any and all liability with respect to the presence of the Pathogens on or within such seeds, or the vulnerability of such seeds, to the Pathogens. Grower acknowledges and agrees that Rupp Seeds and its suppliers shall have no responsibility or liability for any losses or damages relating in any way to the Pathogens under any legal theory including. but not limited to, negligence, breach of warranty, breach of contract, or strict products liability.

Rupp Seeds acknowledges that all other aspects of its express warranty, as contained on the label, do apply, and that any waiver or limitation on the Rupp Seeds express warranty resulting from the terms and conditions of this Agreement, only apply to the presence on or within, or vulnerability of such seeds, to the Pathogens. Grower further agrees that Rupp Seeds and its suppliers also have no liability or responsibility for its watermelon seeds or plants grown therefrom if they are contaminated with the Pathogens after the seeds are delivered to Grower. Grower acknowledges that contamination may occur in a transplant house, in the field, or under circumstances beyond the control of Rupp Seeds and for which Rupp Seeds is not liable to Grower.

GROWER'S SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE REMEDY FOR ANY CLAIM WITH RESPECT TO THE SALE OF SEEDS IS LIMITED IN ALL EVENTS TO A REFUND OF THE PURCHASE PRICE OF THE SEEDS. Grower shall not be entitled to any incidental or consequential damages, including planting or replanting costs, lost profits, or any other expenses, losses or damages. Notice of any claim must be received by Rupp Seeds by registered mail within thirty (30) days after the alleged defect in the seeds becomes apparent to Grower.

GROWER'S AGREEMENT NOT TO RESELL SEEDS OR PLANTS.

This agreement is not binding on JDF until JDF has approved your credit and given you notice of approval. If Maryland law applies, Subtitle 9 of Title 12 of the Maryland Commercial Law will apply.

ACCOUNT TYPE. If your Multi-Use Account arose through JDF's purchase of your existing account balance with a merchant, or at the request of one or more merchants, your Account may be classified as a Merchant Authorized Account. Certain special features or promotions that JDF may offer from time to time may be made available only to Preferred Accounts. Merchant Authorized Accounts are useable only at a merchant who asked JDF to finance your purchases from them. JDF may, in its sole discretion, classify your account as a Preferred Account. When JDF opens your Account, and on each monthly statement, JDF will indicate whether your Account is either a Preferred or Merchant Authorized Account.

ACCOUNT USE. By applying for or accepting a Multi-Use *Agricultural, Commercial or Governmental Account,* you agree to use your Account *primarily* to make purchases for agricultural, commercial or governmental use, and not for personal, family or household use. You agree to pay JDF all amounts charged by the use of the Account, plus Finance Charges, and the other charges described below, as provided in this Agreement.

You agree that JDF is not responsible for the refusal of anyone to allow a purchase to be made through your Multi-Use Account.

CREDIT LIMITS. JDF will establish and advise you of your credit limit(s) when JDF opens your Account and on each monthly statement. JDF may, in JDF's sole discretion, establish and advise you of a special terms credit limit. JDF may also, in its sole discretion, establish separate additional credit limits with special conditions. The special conditions of any special terms or additional credit limit will be disclosed to you when JDF opens your Account, by a merchant at the time of purchase or on your monthly statement. Your use of any such special terms or additional credit limit(s) shall constitute your agreement to any disclosed special conditions.

You agree that JDF may increase or decrease your credit limit(s) at any time, in JDF's sole discretion, without prior notice to you.

You agree to promptly prepare and provide to JDF any financial and Account information that JDF may, in its sole discretion, request from you.

MONTHLY STATEMENT. JDF will send you a monthly statement whenever there is activity on your Account, unless the only activity is a payment in full. Your monthly statement will show your New Balance, any Finance Charge, any Late Fees, the Minimum Required Payment and the Payment Due Date. In addition, it will show your Credit Limit(s), an itemized list of current Purchases, Payments, and Credits, as well as other information concerning your Account. JDF will send your monthly statements on dates and in intervals determined by JDF. Such statement shall be deemed correct and accepted by you unless JDF is notified to the contrary in writing within 60 days of the date of that statement.

If you think your monthly statement is incorrect, write to JDF on a separate sheet at the address shown on the back of your billing statement. Describe the error as best you can and include your Account number in all correspondence.

PAYMENT. The Payment Due Date is the date the payment must be received at the address shown on the front of your monthly statement. You may at any time pay your entire New Balance or pay more than the Minimum Required Payment, and you may avoid or reduce Finance Charges by doing so. However, payment of more than the Minimum Required Payment, while reducing your balance will not prepay your Account or be

applied against future Minimum Required Payments. If your Payment Due Date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, the Payment Due Date will not be extended. All payments must be in U.S. dollars and drawn on funds

on deposit in the United States. Payments must be sent to John Deere Financial, at the address designated on your monthly payment stub or to any other payment address JDF later designates on your monthly statement payment stub.

FINANCE CHARGE RATES. Finance Charges on your Multi-Use Account may be calculated using variable rates that will be determined by reference to a "Base Rate." The Base Rate from which your variable rates will be determined is the annual percentage rate of interest announced publicly from time to time by Citibank, N.A., in New York, New York, as the base rate it uses for interest rate determinations, which was in effect at the close of business on the fifteenth (15th) calendar day of each month, or the next succeeding business day if the fifteenth is not a business day ("Reference Day").

Finance Charges on your Account will be calculated by adding a "Spread" to the Base Rate to arrive at the current rate. The Spreads added to the Base Rate to determine the ANNUAL PERCENTAGE RATES (APRs) that will apply to your Account will be:

Rate increases and decreases that result from changes in the Base Rate will take effect on the first day of the month, or the next succeeding business day if the first day is not a business day, after the Reference Day on which the Base Rate changes.

Changes in your variable rates will apply to your existing balance as well as to future purchases under your Account. An increase in your rate will increase the total Finance Charge accruing on your Account and the balance on which your Minimum Required Payment is calculated.

FINANCE CHARGE CALCULATION. FINANCE CHARGES will accrue on your Account Balance as follows:

JDF will add a FINANCE CHARGE, calculated as shown below, if your New Balance is not paid in full on or before the Payment Due Date. To avoid additional Finance Charges on purchases, you must pay the New Balance in full on or before the Payment Due Date.

The amount of your **FINANCE CHARGES** will be determined as follows:

JDF uses the daily periodic rates and corresponding **APRs** shown in this Agreement. The applicable periodic rate is applied to the "Average Daily Balance" of your purchases, including current transactions, during the current billing cycle.

To get the "Average Daily Balance," JDF takes the beginning balance of your purchases each day, starting with any Previous Balance outstanding on the first day of the monthly billing cycle, adds new purchases and debits, and subtracts payments or credits. This determines the daily balance. Unless JDF elects to use a later date, purchases are added to the daily balance as of the date of purchase.

JDF totals the daily balances for the billing cycle and divides the total by the number of days in the billing cycle. This gives JDF the "Average Daily Balance," which is shown on your monthly statement. Finance Charges may accrue on Special Promotions Transactions at a different rate, as explained in the Special Promotions section of this Agreement.

DEFAULT FINANCE CHARGE RATE. If you are in default, you may no longer qualify for any reduced interest rate Special Promotions and you agree that, at JDF's option, the APR applicable to any outstanding reduced interest rate Special Promotion(s), may be increased to the APR described in this agreement.

A MINIMUM FINANCE CHARGE of One Dollar will be made when the result of the application of the periodic rate(s) to the "Average Daily Balance," is less than One Dollar.

MINIMUM REQUIRED PAYMENT. Except as provided below, you agree to pay each month a combined Minimum Required Payment equal to:

- 1. Any late payment fee due; plus
- 2. Any additional fees due; plus
- 3. Any amount past due; plus
- 4. For Purchases on your Account:
 - (a) Either the greater of: \$25, or 10% of your New Balance (less any Conversion Balance {balances transferred to John Deere Financial from a merchant's accounts receivable} and less any Special Promotions Transaction(s) balances on which no payment is due) if it exceeds \$25;

DUE-IN-FULL PROVISION FOR GOVERNMENTAL ACCOUNTS. If you are a local, state or federal government agency or department, you agree to pay the entire balance of your account on the date shown on your monthly statement.

SPECIAL PROMOTIONS. For some transactions, special promotional financing terms, such as extended free periods, incentive interest rates on certain purchases or for limited time periods or other promotions may be available, at the discretion of JDF. These special terms will be disclosed by the merchant at the time of purchase. Purchases you make during these special promotions will be separately identified on your monthly statement and will become part of the balance on which your FINANCE CHARGE and Minimum Requirement Payment are calculated at the time provided in the special promotions terms disclosure.

These transactions include:

NO-PAYMENTS/NO-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS. Unless otherwise disclosed, minimum monthly payments will be deferred and Finance Charge will not accrue during any disclosed No-Payments/ No-Interest period described. Finance Charges will accrue at the APR applicable to your Account after the due date of your No-Payments/No-Interest transaction, unless otherwise disclosed.

SPECIAL TERMS TRANSACTIONS. Unless otherwise disclosed, Finance Charge will accrue from the date of purchase, which may be prior to your receipt of the merchandise, and throughout any special terms period. A special terms transaction may include that no payment on that transaction will be due until the end of the special terms period, which will be disclosed to you. Otherwise, payment will be due as described in this Agreement. Accrued Finance Charge must still be paid by you if the entire special terms balance is paid in full by the end of the special terms period. A reduced special terms finance charge rate may apply to the transaction, which will be disclosed to you. Otherwise, the finance charge rate will be the APR applicable to your Account. The entire balance of the special terms transaction, plus any accrued finance charge, will be due in full by the disclosed due date.

SAME AS CASH TRANSACTIONS. Unless otherwise disclosed, minimum monthly payments will be deferred and Finance Charge will accrue during any Same As Cash period. No Finance Charge will be due until the end of the Same As Cash period and any accrued Finance Charge will be waived if the entire Same As Cash balance is paid in full by the end of this Same As Cash period.

OTHER FEES and CHARGES.

LATE PAYMENT FEES. If within 20 days after the Payment Due Date, JDF has not received payment of at least the current portion of your Minimum Required Payment (Minimum Required Payment plus unpaid late payment fees and past due amounts), JDF will add to your Account a late payment fee of

RETURNED PAYMENT FEE. If you send JDF a check or electronic payment authorization that is dishonored upon first presentment, JDF will add to your Account a fee of \$35.

COLLECTION COSTS. Upon default, you will pay for expenses incurred in connection with the enforcement of our remedies, without limitation, repossession, repair and collections costs, any attorney's fees plus court costs and related fees including any bankruptcy fees and costs, to the extent permitted by applicable law.

CREDIT BALANCES. Any credit balance in excess of \$5 on your account will be refunded within 30 business days from JDF's receipt of your written request. Otherwise, JDF will refund to you any credit balance remaining on your account after six months. You agree that JDF may retain any credit balance if it is less than \$5 or if JDF does not know your address and it cannot be traced through the last address or telephone number provided to JDF.

ACCEPTING PAYMENT. You agree that JDF can accept late or partial payments, as well as payments marked "paid in full" or with other restrictive endorsements, without losing any of its rights under this Agreement.

DISCLOSURE OF FINANCIAL INFORMATION. You agree that JDF may report your performance under this Agreement to credit reporting agencies and others who request a credit reference from JDF. You agree that JDF may ask credit reporting agencies or others you list as a credit reference for consumer reports or information regarding your credit history at any time for all legitimate purposes, including credit decisions and the review and collection of your account. You authorize JDF to share information regarding your Account with its corporate affiliates and other companies that offer products and services JDF believes

may be of interest to you. JDF's affiliates may use certain consumer report information as a factor in establishing your eligibility for credit. If you object to this, you must notify JDF by calling John Deere Financial Customer Service at 1-800-356-9033, and providing your name, Social Security number, address and account number; and, after a reasonable processing time of up to 30 days, certain information will not be provided to those affiliates.

CLOSING YOUR ACCOUNT. You may close your Account at any time by notifying JDF in writing. You agree that JDF may close or suspend your Account to future purchases at any time without prior notice. You agree that JDF may close or suspend your Account to future purchases if your Account has no activity for I2 or more months. You agree that, regardless of the closing or suspension of your Account, you remain responsible for paying the amount you owe JDF according to the terms of this Agreement.

SECURITY INTEREST. You grant JDF a purchase money security interest in all merchandise purchased through your Account, and its proceeds, including insurance proceeds, but this provision does not apply if you reside in NC and the APR on a purchase or transaction exceeds 15%. JDF's security interest continues until such merchandise is paid for in full by application of your payments in the manner plescribed in

PAYMENT APPLICATION. You agree that your payments will be applied as JDF determines in its sole discretion. You agree that JDF has this discretion and that JDF may exercise it to suit its own convenience and interests, without further notice to you. You also agree that JDF may change how it applies payments at any time without notice to you. You acknowledge that the exercise of this

discretion by JDF may result in cases in which the application of your payments to the Account creates higher Finance Charges than other payment application methods and that this may include payments allocated to balances with lower APRs before balances with higher APRs and/or to balances with longer promotional periods before balances with shorter or no promotional periods.

You agree that your payments will be credited as of the date of receipt at the address on the payment stub of your Monthly Statement if received by 11:00 a.m. Central Time Monday through Friday (otherwise next business day); but if payment is not accompanied by the payment stub, is not sent in the envelope we provided, includes other items, such as other checks, staples or paper clips, or is not received at that location, credit may be delayed up to five days.

MERCHANT CHARGEBACKS. JDF may charge back to a merchant who sold goods or services to you on your Account, any part of your Account balance related to those purchases. In that event, this Agreement will be deemed assigned to the merchant to the extent of the chargeback. You agree to such an assignment and further agree to pay the merchant the amount of such chargeback in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

DEFAULT. You agree that you will be in default if: (a) you fail to pay the Minimum Required Payment within 20 days after the Payment Due Date; (b) the value of JDF's security interest in any collateral is materially impaired; (c) your ability to repay is materially reduced by your exceeding your credit limit, by a change in your employment, by a change in your other obligations, by bankruptcy or insolvency proceedings involving you, or (for community property state residents only) by a change in your marital status or domicile:

(d) you die or become incompetent; (e) you have provided JDF false or misleading information relating to your credit application or Account; (f) you fail to perform any other of your obligations under the terms of this Agreement as it may be amended; or (g) you are in default under any other agreement you have with JDF or any of its affiliates.

You agree that, upon your default, JDF may close your Account to future purchases and that JDF may demand immediate payment of your entire Account balance, after giving you any notice and opportunity

to cure the default required by applicable law. In addition, you agree that JDF shall have all the rights of a secured creditor under the Uniform Commercial Code and other applicable law.

DELAY IN ENFORCEMENT. You agree that JDF can delay enforcing its rights under this Agreement without losing them.

ELECTRONIC DISCLOSURE. You agree that any notices and disclosures related to your account can be delivered to you in printed form or by electronic means if you provided an electronic mail address to JDF when you applied for this Account or at a later date. Until JDF receives notice of a new electronic mail address, JDF may continue to send such notices and disclosures to the electronic mail address you most recently provided to JDF.

GOVERNING LAW. This Agreement must be approved, and all charges and payments to your Account processed by JDF at its office in Madison, Wisconsin. Therefore, this Agreement and your account will be governed by the substantive law of the United States and to the extent state law applies to this Agreement the substantive law of the State of Wisconsin; regardless of whether or not you reside in Wisconsin. The law of your state of residence will apply to JDF's recovery of any collateral located there.

This is the entire Agreement between you and JDF relating to your Multi-Use Account and no oral changes can be made.

Invalidity of any provision of this Agreement shall not affect the validity and enforceability of the remainder of its terms.

CHANGING THIS AGREEMENT. IMPORTANT: READ BEFORE SIGNING. THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT SHOULD BE READ CAREFULLY BECAUSE ONLY THOSE TERMS IN WRITING ARE ENFORCEABLE. NO OTHER TERMS OR ORAL PROMISES NOT CONTAINED IN THIS WRITTEN CONTRACT MAY BE LEGALLY ENFORCED. YOU MAY CHANGE THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT ONLY BY ANOTHER WRITTEN AGREEMENT. You agree that JDF may change this Agreement, including the Finance Charge Calculation and the APR, at any time, by providing prior notice to you. To the extent that the law permits and JDF indicates in the notice, the changes will apply to your existing Account balance as well as to future transactions.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT PROCEDURES FOR OPENING A NEW ACCOUNT. 
